9. "Without self-knowledge you have no root in yourselves personally; you may endure for a



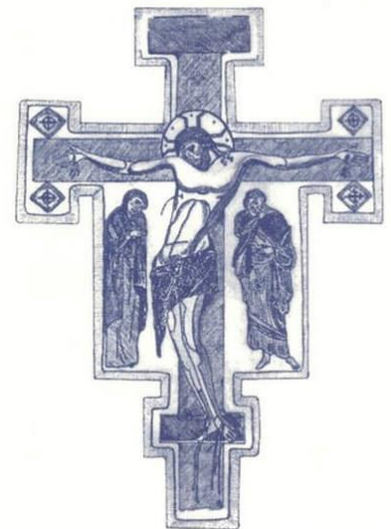
time, but under affliction or persecution your faith will not last."

Introducing Holy Name of Mary Chapel

A Place of Peace in the Endless Mountains

Ave Maria! Nestled in the Endless Mountains region of Towanda, Pennsylvania, located on the historic Roosevelt Highway, in the third story of a nineteenth century Victorian home, an unexpected Old Roman Catholic chapel can be found. One might expect such a chapel to be hidden away for private use only with little to no effect on the local community or world around it. However, this chapel is a vibrant and engaged parish receiving many visitors each day through the wonders of modern technology: cameras, lights, and the world wide web. Welcome to Holy Name of Mary Catholic Chapel!

Holy Name of Mary, established in 2018, began broadcasting live divine services, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, on March 1, 2020, the First Sunday in



Lent. The response from the faithful was overwhelming with local, national, and international guests virtually attending Holy Mass and Liturgy of the Hours. Soon after, our pastor, Father Daniel Storrs, canon priest in the Society of Mercy, found himself providing pastoral care through video chat and building community with Catholics and Christians from all walks of life fulfilling our mission: We are the diverse People of God walking in the Affirming Love of the Fruit of Mary’s Womb, Jesus Christ. In the past twenty-one months, the Chapel has offered the Sacrifice of the Mass for over five hundred intentions, remembering the names of many loved ones both living and reposed. In a typical month, the Chapel receives 600 views and over 120 hours watched and prayed. No matter where you reside, you can join us on YouTube or Facebook @holynamemary or at www.holynamemary.org. We also host a private Facebook group, *Holy Name of Mary Chapel Family*, for our parishioners to engage with one another and stay up to date on Mary's Chapel. Tradition and inclusivity are core values at Holy Name of Mary. In a world of constant change, we broadcast liturgy, according to the Third Edition

Roman Rite, that is traditionally beautiful and authentically Catholic, while maintaining awareness of the spiritual needs of modern people. Therefore, we invite all of Mary's baptized children of goodwill who genuinely seek the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, sacramentally or spiritually, to participate faithfully in our Chapel community; regardless of race, nationality, age, gender or gender expression, sexuality, marital status, socioeconomic status, political affiliation, or other blessed diversities. For some individuals, Mary's Chapel is the only parish they can attend due to location, health issues, or fear of judgement from others.

We recognize the catechesis and spiritual care of our children must be a priority in the Catholic faith. Therefore, we created *Tony & Owl: My Catholic Friends*, an animated children's ministry. Our debut video celebrated and explained the Ascension of

Christ. Currently, a second video on the life of the Blessed Virgin Mary is in production and should be released in early 2022.

In the local community, we have provided over two hundred pounds of pantry staples for food banks, and our pastor currently volunteers at the Endless Mountain Missions Center (homeless shelter) and Grace Connection (emergency aid and utility assistance). Mary's Chapel has distributed rosaries, holy cards, and catechetical materials to hundreds of individuals. As we draw near to Advent, we have chosen to sponsor a family of six, in financial need after a housing disaster, providing for both their Christmas gifts and dinner. Holy Name of Mary Catholic Chapel may be located in an unexpected place, but our ministry is available to all God's people with just a click on their computer or phone.
