ARCHBISHOP'S GRAVESITE RENOVATED

Archbishop Arnold Harris Mathew's Final Resting Place

It has long been a goal for our Primate, Archbishop Douglas Lewins, SSM, to renovate the gravesite of Archbishop Arnold Harris Mathew. Archbishop Mathew, who died in 1920, was laid to rest at St. Giles' Anglican Church in South Mimms in the United Kingdom. His gravesite was removed once before but had since suffered the ravages of time. Archbishop Lewins gathered together donations from funders to help renovate the grave which was extensively cleaned and the lettering was clarified. All Old Roman Catholics are grateful to Archbishop Lewins for helping preserve our history through the beautification of Archbishop Mathew's grave.

Recently, the Old Roman Catholic Church in Great Britain, the Old Roman Catholic Church in North America (administered by the Society of Mercy), and the Old Roman Catholic Church Latin Rite agreed to partner together effective December 10, 2020. Catholic Church Latin Rite was represented in the agreement by Archbishop George Roberts (pictured above). The partnership between the jurisdictions resembles an earlier one established by the Society, the Old Roman Catholic Church English Rite and the Old Roman Catholic Church in Great Britain. MISSAL IN FINAL STAGES OF PRODUCTION


Important Liturgical Source for the Society

Archbishop Arnold Harris Mathew developed a Missal in 1909 for what was then the Old Catholic Church in Great Britain. The Missal marked one of the first translations into English of the Tridentine Mass for use on the altar. It was republished in the 1960s by AMS Press and subsequently by Apocryphile Press. It has always been our goal to produce an Altar Missal version and it is finally finished after extensive revisions. The formatting of the original was edited, corrections were made, and feasts added after 1909 were included as options. A special thanks goes to Archbishop Roberts for helping with editing. It will be bound in linen and includes rubrics in full color and a Latin Ordinary of the Mass. We are very excited to complete the project and hope it will be a useful resource for those everywhere wanting to use the Tridentine Missal in English.
