MAXIMS ON THE LOVE OF GOD

1. Nothing is more pleasant than to love God, provided this love moves you to undergo many tribulations.
2. Have always, as far as possible, God in your mind and your mind in God. Think of nothing, love nothing apart from Him, and whether alone or in public, never turn your eyes away from His. "Lord, what do I desire except You. What could I wish for besides You?"
3. We should make more account of renouncing self-will than of raising others from the dead.
4. We should not measure our spiritual progress by our deeds, our amiability, or our love of solitude, but by the violence we do ourselves.
5. No creature can bring the soul such joy as comes from the Holy Spirit.
6. Do not put faith in constant happiness, and fear most when all smiles upon you.
7. If it were necessary to die a thousand times a day to save one soul, I should willingly agree to do so.
8. The more alert a man is to the defects of others, the more negligent he is in observing his own.
9. If you fear men beyond measure, you will never do anything great for God.
10. There is nothing of which apostolic men have more need than interior recollection.
